**Carol Hill** writes:

***Rose-tinted spectacles or 'Faith'?***

There is a timeworn word 'Journey' used to describe Christian living. Our lives are not static – we go through various landscapes as we mature, and come across stumbling blocks. Learning to negotiate around these is what gives us character and strength to keep going. We learn who we really are, at core.

Lately my journey has taken me into an examination of 'faith'. I go into nursing homes and hospitals, meeting devoted Christian people caught in webs of dementia and deep sadness. I see people confronted with compromised mobility wondering how they will cope when sent home, but not wanting to go into nursing homes. I see people tired of living.

And I wonder about what I can offer them.

I believe in facing reality and don't minimise people's pain. I don't offer them that 'rose-tinted' view that denies suffering in this life.

So, what exactly IS faith? The Letter to the Hebrews tells us: "*Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen*". (11:1)

There is something about this particular verse that echoes deep within. Words cannot describe something so elusive and intangible as faith – but this verse captures its essence. I once read a book written by someone who came to the UK on the kinder transport – Lore Segal. She stayed with Christians, and they taught her about Jesus. Refugees were also taught by a visiting rabbi and she took her confusion to him and said:

"It says in the Bible that God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son .... **and I was surprised at the sudden taste of tears with the sweetness of the words in my mouth.**"

This is faith, it is 'other', luminous, inexplicable and there despite

circumstance. It lies deep within all of us, nascent, awaiting coming into full bloom.

So, what can we offer those suffering? Prayer is an amazing gift. It opens up a channel between earth and heaven, enabling others to experience God.

Psalm 8 (Message) tells us  
*God is a safe house for the battered,  
A sanctuary during bad times.  
The moment you arrive; you relax;  
You are never sorry you knocked.*

Circumstances don't necessarily change – but the atmosphere *always* does.

Psalm 10 (Message) tells us:

*The victim's faint pulse picks up;  
The hearts of the hopeless pump red blood  
As you put your ear to their lips*

**God hears us – he 'puts HIS ear to our lips'. He comes CLOSE to us.**

Is Faith just seeing our life through a different coloured lens? No, it alters the very fabric of our lives, our reality is completely changed. We know there is a safe house in God, and that he gives us strength to survive whatever life may throw at us. It is a whole new dimension of living. One might even say it is like being born again ...
